This Sunday, our racial justice plate collection will go to the Equal Justice Initiative, the recipient that topped our ranked-choice voting last Sunday. EJI is committed to ending mass incarceration in the United States, to challenging racial and economic injustice, and to protecting basic human rights for the most vulnerable in American society. Founded in 1989 by Bryan Stevenson, acclaimed public interest lawyer and bestselling author of Just Mercy, EJI provides legal representation to people who have been illegally convicted, unfairly sentenced, or abused in state jails and prisons. The organization challenges the death penalty and excessive punishment and provides re-entry assistance to formerly incarcerated people. 
fundraiser for the monthly meals and groceries. Please see the e-blast for more details.
